FREE FALL BALTIMORE STARTS TODAY!

Area Attractions Offer Free Events October 1-31, 2018

The 13th annual **Free Fall Baltimore**, a program of the **Baltimore Office of Promotion & The Arts (BOPA)**, with major support presented by **BGE, An Exelon Company**, begins today with numerous free arts and cultural activities at attractions throughout Baltimore City. The program spotlights the arts in Baltimore with artist talks, dance performances, exhibitions, festivals, films, free admission, recitals and concerts, theater, walking tours and workshops. In conjunction with National Arts & Humanities Month, Free Fall Baltimore takes place Monday, October 1 through Wednesday, October 31, 2018. All events are free, but many require advance registration. To register or to view events, visit www.freefallbaltimore.org.

Free Fall Baltimore offers an array of events from more than 60 area attractions and organizations. Here's a glance at a few of the events: "**Native Community Art Exhibition: BAIC Supporting Indians & Art for 50 Years**" by Baltimore American Indian Center & Heritage Museum displays articles of regalia including clothing, beadwork, quillwork, jewelry, dance staffs and wood carvings used by Native Americans and Alaskan Natives community artists at cultural events throughout October; **Harbor Harvest Fall Children's Festival** on October 14 by Waterfront Partnership of Baltimore features an urban pumpkin patch, a petting zoo, a hay maze, face painting, pumpkin decorating, pony rides, live music, entertainment by the Uncle Devin Show, food trucks and stilt walkers; **Free Community Sing** on October 19 is an evening of spirituals and gospel music with Baltimore Choral Arts, Northside Baptist Church and the Community Concert Choir of Baltimore, Inc.; **Station North Avenue - New Public Sites Walking Tour** on October 21 by New Public Sites explores the history of North Avenue as a transportation and cultural corridor, and the ongoing impact of creative placemaking in the Station North Arts and Entertainment District; and the fifth annual **Baltimore Dance Crews Project Community Jam** on October 27 by Baltimore Dance Crews Project excites with

performances from dancers from across the region.
